

This SCRUMS User Guide is to explain the process of registering in the system as a coach or match official. If you have not previously registered in SCRUMS, proceed to **Step 1** below. If you have already registered in SCRUMS, proceed to **Step 2**.


#### STEP 1

If you have never previously registered in SCRUMS, please do so at <a href="https://scrums.scottishrugby.org/terms-and-conditions">https://scrums.scottishrugby.org/terms-and-conditions</a>

#### Please note;

- You will be asked if you are a player or non-player. If you are both, please select 'player' at this stage as you will still have the option to create your coach / match official profile.
- When asked to select a club / school, if you do not have links to any clubs/schools, please select 'Unaffiliated'.
- Full step by step instructions on the registration process can be found <u>here</u>.

When you have completed the initial registration process you will be asked the question 'Are you a coach / match official?'. Click yes and you will begin the process of creating a coach / match official profile. Click yes and you will begin the process of creating a coach / match official profile. (Please proceed to Step 3 of this user guide to continue.)






#### STEP 2

If you have already registered in SCRUMS, either as a player or in any other role such as teacher or club official, please log into SCRUMS at <a href="https://scrums.scottishrugby.org/login">https://scrums.scottishrugby.org/login</a>.

If you have forgotten your password, please follow the link to reset it.


Once you have logged into SCRUMS, click on your name in the top right of the screen. You will then see a button along the top of the screen to 'Create Coach / Match Official Profile'. Click this button to begin the process. (Please proceed to Step 3 of this user guide to continue).





### STEP 3


Please indicate if you are a coach, match official or both.





#### STEP 4


- If you are a coach, please answer the questions about the nature of your role and current weekly time commitment, then select the club / school where you are coaching.
- You can select more than one (using the 'Add another club/school' button) but please only do this if you are actively coaching with each one selected.
- For each club selected, you will be asked if you are involved in coaching youth or mini rugby at that club (for schools we do not need to ask this question).
- If you did not indicate that you are also a match official, please click 'Next' and proceed to Step 6A of this user guide.
- If you indicated that you are also a match official, there are additional questions to answer, so please continue to Step
   5A of this user guide.





#### STEP 5A


- If you are a match official, please indicate if you are a Society Referee or a Community Referee (club, school, university).
- If you are a Society Referee, please select your Society and also your club / university (or leave it as 'Not linked to club/university' if you are not affiliated to any).
- Please click 'Next' (then continue to Step 6 of this user guide).





#### STEP 5B

- If you are a Community Referee, please select your club / school. You may select one club, one school or both, if relevant to your match official role.
- If you are not affiliated to any club or school then please leave both options as 'Not linked...'. If this is the case, when you click 'Next' you will be asked which local authority area you live in.
- Please click 'Next' (then continue to Step 6A of this user guide).






#### STEP 6A

Please provide information on the qualifications relevant to your role as a coach / match official.


- The information you provide in this section will be checked against Scottish Rugby's records to ensure that we hold the most accurate information on your qualification history.
- Please tick the box next to each qualification you have achieved since 2005 (select all that apply). If known, please
  also indicate the date and venue of the course. All qualifications will be verified by Scottish Rugby before they
  appear on your SCRUMS record.
- If you are a coach who has previously completed a match official qualification, or a match official who has previously completed a coaching qualification, please provide details of these as they can be held in your record, even if you are no longer active in that role.





#### STEP 6B


- If you have completed any other relevant rugby qualifications with another sporting governing body or organisation, you can indicate this at the bottom of the form but you will need to provide proof of completion before your SCRUMS record is updated.
- Please provide details of the qualification then click next when complete.





#### STEP 7


- If you are not a coach, you will not see this page (please proceed to Step 8 of this user guide).
- If you are a coach, you will be asked to provide your PVG number. All individuals coaching youth rugby (being rugby at Under-18 level and below) at a club, must be a member of the PVG Scheme and linked to that club. If you know your PVG number, please provide it here. It will then be verified by Scottish Rugby before appearing in your SCRUMS record.





#### STEP 8

- On this final page you can review the information you have provided and click submit.
- You will see separate sections for 'Coach Profile', 'Match Official Profile' and 'Qualifications' depending on your role and the information you have provided (so you will only see those applicable to you).
- If you wish to make any changes before submitting, you can use the back buttons to navigate back to the page where changes are required. If you do that, please remember to come back to this page and click 'submit'.



The process is now complete, thank you for creating your coach / match official profile in SCRUMS. You can view your profile at any time by logging into SCRUMS and clicking on 'My Profiles' in the left hand menu.
